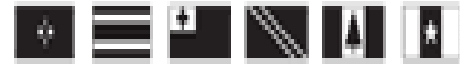

GIFT SUGGESTIONS

Here are two in-church suggestions: Make a donation to the **Good Samaritan Fund**. To do this, write a check to PUMC with "Good Samaritan Fund" in the memo blank. Or, write a check to help with the **Youth Mission Trip** this summer. They are trying so hard to raise funds to pay for the bus and for some of the expenses of the youth and chaperones who will be making this trip. Write a check to PUMC with "Youth Mission Trip" in the memo blank.

Or, reaching out a bit, you could support **Heifer Live Gifts** - See www.HeiferInternational.com and decide if you'd like to give a goat, a hive of bees, a flock of ducks, etc., to a family living in poverty. Write a check payable to PUMC and write "Heifer Live Gifts" in the memo blank, along with the name of the animal(s) you wish to provide. Or, you might want to donate to the **UMCOR** (United Methodist Committee on Relief) **Storm Fund** - Write a check to PUMC with "Storm Fund" in the memo blank.

(The great thing about donations to the above causes is that 100 percent of the funds go to the projects. The administration costs are paid in other ways via apportionments, etc.)

A COMMUNITY GIFT SUGGESTION

Shop with a Cop - The Plainfield Academy, which is in our neighborhood, is holding a "Shop with a Cop" program for the students and their families who have financial difficulties. The school staff raises the funds (about \$350 for each family) with the help from our community and the Plainfield Police Officers take the students and their families Christmas shopping.

This program not only helps financially strained families in our community during the Christmas season but also helps families whose children have trouble with law enforcement. Through this program families of our community develop prevention relationships with police officers and when the families experience troubles they can approach officers more comfortably.

We encourage you to consider this program as a gift in honor of a loved one instead of buying them a new tie, perfume etc.! You can write a check to PUMC with the note "Shop with a Cop" and drop it in Sunday offering plates or the church office.

UMVIM Mission Team to Haiti

United Methodist Volunteers in Mission (UMVIM) has been active in Haiti for over thirty years, addressing needs in education, health and housing. On January 12, 2010, a powerful earthquake caused widespread and unprecedented loss of life and property in the Caribbean country. In response to the crisis, UMVIM leadership proposed a new approach to a collaborative effort with the Eglise Methodist d'Haiti (EMH, the Methodist Church of Haiti).

On **February 6, 2013**, an UMVIM mission team from the Northern Illinois Conference will travel to Haiti to continue support of the recovery/rebuilding efforts. The team will be assigned to one of the ongoing projects, and will provide funding to purchase supplies and building materials, as well as hire local skilled workers who lead the reconstruction of churches and schools. A primary role of the mission team in Haiti is to provide support to those skilled workers. Equally important is the presence that we provide in the community. We spend time getting to know local church members, worshipping with them, and especially spending time with the children of the area where we work and live for a week.

There are still openings on the team, which will depart on February 6 and return on February 14. Pastor Eun-Hye believes this to be a wonderful opportunity so if you are interested take a few minutes to chat with her about it. 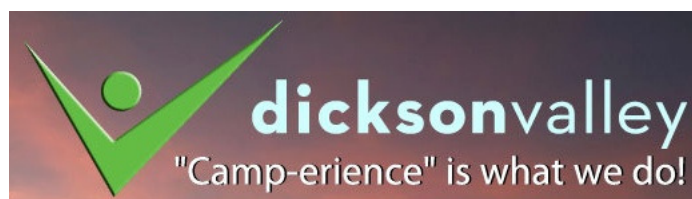

Young Adults Surf the Net Church

Young adults are connecting at the newest “hot spot” in Rockford. It’s not the local coffee shop but a new faith community. The Net Church is trying to link a new way of worshiping with a tech-savvy generation of people who feel disenfranchised, who see church as irrelevant and who are putting up “firewalls”.

“This is a dream five years in the making,” says Rev. Eric Blachford who along with Rev. Kevin Clark began envisioning this kind of church as seminary roommates. “We began questioning why people we grew up with, went to school with, were confirmed with, played with as kids were not going to church and how do we reach them?”



Following seminary, the two went their separate ways. It wasn’t until October 2011 through a chance encounter in Dubuque, Iowa that their dream was re-energized. The two met up for a movie and dessert with some other clergy friends. One of the pastors who was present heard their passion and shared it with Rockford District Superintendent Ouk-Yean Kim Jueng. She’d been wanting to start a new faith community in Rockford for younger people. Soon after Blachford and Clark were appointed to take on this ministry and began planning The Net Church to reach those missing 20 and 30 somethings.

“We started by organizing home groups we call “hot spots” and connecting with people of all different backgrounds—some who’ve had some church upbringing to those who’ve had none to even one young woman who said she was a pagan,” says Blachford. “We have single moms, parents with young kids, people fresh out of college, some trying to find a job. It’s a very diverse group.”

Someone hosts a home group each week. They share a meal together, participate in fun activities and finish the evening with teaching and prayer. “Our mantra is fellowship leads to followership,” says Clark. “If we can bring people together and connect them with each other—we can connect them with God.”

The Net held its first monthly worship service at the YMCA on Oct. 27. They get the word out through texts and Facebook. The Net is also networking with the community through mission. Groups gathered in August to paint a local school as part of the conference-wide Seeds to Succeed event. Recently, a team participated in a CROP Walk to raise \$500 to fight hunger. Next March, they’re planning a Nets-Tourney, a 3 on 3 basketball tournament to support local food pantries.

“We are intentionally building relationships and seeking to love people right where they are. Worship isn’t always the front door (of a church). We are creating an environment and safe place for people to find their own way. We are just fellow sojourners on the journey inviting others to follow us as we all follow Christ,” says Blachford.
